Bio blurb: Sarah Forrester recently defended her dissertation in the Mental Health department of the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health. Sarah's dissertation work explored racial disparities in cognitive functioning and possible mechanisms for that disparity and she has recently published research using latent methods to predict conversion from mild cognitive impairment to Alzheimer's disease. She is especially interested in how psychosocial stress may be associated with biological irregularities that contribute to disorders of cognitive aging among minorities.
