“Access to Care: Current and Future Metrics for Research and Quality Improvement”

Presented by: Peter Kaboli, MD

Dr. Kaboli is a Hospitalist and former Chief of Medicine at the Iowa City VA Healthcare System and Professor in the Department of Internal Medicine, University of Iowa Carver College of Medicine. He earned his BS in Biology, MS in Epidemiology, and his MD, all from the University of Iowa. He completed his residency at LDS Hospital in Salt Lake City, UT in 1998 and General Medicine Fellowship and VA Quality Scholars Fellowship at the University of Iowa/Iowa City VAMC in 2000. Dr. Kaboli's research interests include healthcare access, rural health, inpatient medical care quality, development of valid methods for measuring medication appropriateness, and interventions to optimize medication delivery to vulnerable Veteran populations.

His presentation, "Access to Care: Current and Future Metrics for Research and Quality Improvement", will focus on the how access is measured as it relates to a conceptual model of healthcare access that was developed as part of a VA State of the Art conference. It will include metrics for research and quality improvement and encompass both objective and subjective measures of access. The audience will provide feedback and insights into their own access related experiences as patients, providers, and researchers.
