

Important Notice

The UMW Graduate Program in Nursing will be moving to an all DNP program and curriculum starting in 2016-2017.

- A new Master's pathway: Master of Science in Nursing with a concentration in Population Health will be offered starting in 2016-2017.
- Pathway options include:
 - GEP to Master of Science in Nursing with a concentration in Population Health with entry starting Fall 2015.
 - Baccalaureate to Master of Science in Nursing with a concentration in Population Health with entry starting Fall 2016.
- Traditional Master's Adult Gerontology Acute Care Nurse Practitioner and Adult Gerontology Primary Care Nurse Practitioner Pathways will be admitted for entry into our Traditional Master's Program for the Fall of 2015 for the full time option ONLY.
*Please Note: We will no longer have the traditional masters pathway option for preparation as a Nurse Practitioner after Fall 2015.
- Current GSN Master's program students entering for Fall 2014 will be completing the current curriculum through graduation with the exception of any student who requests a change in progression during their program of study.
- A student who requests a change in progression in the current curriculum will require taking course work in the new curriculum in order to graduate in their program of study. This will result in a longer time in the program and additional course cost for students.
- Faculty will make every effort to support our students as this transition to the new curriculum occurs.
