| PRESENTATIONS | <p>After welcoming everyone, Dr. Ziedonis turned the program over to Caroline McGrath, RN, BSN, Executive Director, UMASS Adolescent Treatment Unit, and Peter Metz , MD, Director of Communities of Care, and kids from the Worcester Adolescent Unit who had prepared a program for today, honoring the retirements of longstanding and beloved Psychiatry employees, Mary Handley and Kevin MacDonald.</p> <p>Several wonderful youth from the Adolescent Unit presented a lively five act performance including, Basketball Wizardry, a poem read entitled, "Reflections", a Hula Hoop Extravaganza, Houdini Card Trick, and a lively Hip Hop Finale called, "Get Your Umbrellas Ready" The kids received a standing ovation from a very appreciative audience!</p> <p>Following the performance, Mary Handley gave the following remarks:</p> <p><i>"When I first heard about today's recognition, I was surprised & touched. Then, I came to view Doug's invitation as a quasi "curtain call" -- the way stage actors are recognized for a good performance or a lengthy run.</i></p> <p><i>My first act in the Department of Psychiatry ran from November 1989 - October 1998. Parenthetically, these were among the best years of my working life. Energy was high. "Excellence" was the goal. Creativity ran rampant.</i></p> <p><i>My fiscal philosophy was simple & was the basis for state contract decision-making: the program runs the budget; the budget does not run the program!</i></p> <p><i>From those magical days, I moved to the chorus -- always part of the show but no longer involved in the day-to-day management of state contracts. Eydie Cullen & her "troupe" in Commonwealth Medicine took over that role while I monitored things behind the scenes.</i></p> <p><i>Now that I have center stage one last time, I'd like to close with a quote from one of today's best-known actors, Meryl Streep. | | <p><i>what is apparently different...." I don't know if that's the secret to acting, but I do know that it's one of the secrets to working in the Department of Psychiatry. No where have I ever experienced more collaboration between faculty & among faculty & staff than in Psych state contracts. I am really at my best!</i></p> <p><i>To all of you who saved my life When I just wanted to die You put an end to all my strife About that, I would not lie.</i></p> <p><i>You stuck with me through thick and thin And gave my life some hope Showing me where to begin Saying "yes", when I said "Nope"!</i></p> <p><i>I want to say, to you, my friends To my true friends, I know, You made me see beginnings not ends I love you, dear Westborough.</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Mary and Kevin thanked the department for the recognition they received today and summed up their view of the value and strength of the Department of Psychiatry. <p>Dr. Ziedonis next thanked the residents for their ongoing participation in the "Getting to Know Your Resident" segment and introduced Kathryn (Katie) Sikorez, MD, Chief Resident in Ambulatory Psychiatry who will also be joining the Psychiatry faculty. Katie reported the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Residents are now part of the OPD treatment teams, which has improved care coordination and communication between prescribing providers and therapists, especially for patients receiving split medication & therapy treatment ○ We added formal experiences in the Depression Specialty Clinic with Drs. Deligiannidis & Rothschild, giving residents more expertise in diagnosing and treating treatment-resistant depression ○ Dr. Gonzalez was able to secure another SAMHSA grant (he did this 2 or 3 years ago, too) to offer a buprenorphine prescribing and certification course to the OPD residents, as well as some family medicine and internal medicine residents. We now have 13 psychiatry residents fully trained and eligible for the additional certification to prescribe buprenorphine for the treatment of opioid dependence. | |
