 PRESENTATIONS	<p>Dr. Ziedonis welcomed attendees giving a brief, broad update regarding the departmental budget and UMASS system budget. A more in depth update on the budget will be given at next month's department meeting. Despite the pressures of the economy and impact on programs through diminished state funding, we have seen an expansion of growth. UMass as a whole system has done well. Dr. Ziedonis thanked everyone for their individual and team contributions resulting in continued positive growth within the department.</p> <p> Dr. Lidz, as Chair of the Ethics Committee presented information on the role of the Ethics Committee. Because we live in a complex regulatory environment and since mental illness is a stigmatized category, committal of patients to in-patient care can have a host of pitfalls including national scandals and federal bureaucracy. The Ethics Committee provides expertise and makes recommendations to the Chair on ethical issues in the Department including the development of necessary policy, overseeing the education and training on ethical issues in research and treatment, and providing consultation, as appropriate, to faculty and staff of the Department on ethical problems and conflicts of interest. Ethics is not a precise science but is a dialogue utilizing experience and judgment and is intended to be an educational process. Dr. Ziedonis announced the upcoming **Visiting Professor Sangkeun Chung, M.D., Ph.D., Professor & Chair, Department of Psychiatry, Chonbuk National University Medical School** commencing August 15, 2010. He received his MD in 1985 from Chonbuk National University Medical School in Jeonju, Korea and his PhD in 1995 from Chonnam National University in Gwangju, Korea. Dr. Chung is an accomplished psychiatrist who has specialized in mood disorders, tobacco addiction, and sleep disorders. In addition to being an outstanding researcher and physician, he also holds a variety of leadership positions throughout the country. He is serving as director of Education Committee, Korean Society for Depressive and Bipolar Disorders, and director of the Planning Committee, Korean Academy of Anxiety Disorders.

Dr. Chung is very interested in coming to UMass to learn more about tobacco dependence and mental illness research and treatment approaches. He is also interested in our cross-cultural research and will help advance our research efforts in this area, including specific issues of addiction and mood disorders. He will work with Sun Kim and other faculty on a variety of projects, starting with culture-tailored treatment of tobacco dependence in native Korean and American-Korean smokers. We anticipate that Dr. Chung will be able to make substantial contributions to addiction psychiatry and tobacco cessation with his knowledge and expertise in these areas. His vast interests have the potential to increase the faculty and staff understanding of different areas of psychiatry as well.

(Among current criteria for academic promotion, we faculty are required to acquire a regional or national reputation in our respective fields. An important aspect of how we achieve this is public speaking as symposium participants, invited speakers, presenters at our professional societies, or other such activities outside UMMS. Whereas our library maintains a licensing agreement that permits our use of many text-based copyrighted materials (e.g. articles and other portions of works) for teaching on the campuses of UMMS, we receive no such license protection for use of such material outside of UMMS, such as in webinars or external presentations.
