PRESENTATIONS	Dr. Ziedonis welcomed everyone and acknowledged the kick off of the new academic year. He opened the meeting by introducing Marcia Fowler, MA, JD, Commissioner, Massachusetts Department of Mental Health and Debra Pinals, MD, DMH Interim Deputy Commissioner for Clinical & Professional Services/State Medical Director. Commissioner Fowler was present for the day meeting with faculty leaders who are managing key partnership areas, Adult/Child, public sector, clinical, training, forensics and CMHSR research, staff and leaders within UMass Memorial and the Medical School System. She is looking forward to expanding DMH's partnership and in particular, learning about our work in Behavioral Health Integration. She presented an overview of DMH and its programs and highlighted the mobile forensic evaluation services model rolled out by DMH two years ago. A national search for a Clinical Director resulted in David Tobin, PhD (introduced later in the program by Dr. Ira Packer) being appointed to the position. The Mobile Forensic Evaluation Service provides risk management services with over 400 evaluations per year and has just recently expanded to go beyond Tewksbury and central Massachusetts. The new Worcester Recovery Center and Hospital, a \$302M state-of-the-art hospital, is the largest non-road project in the history of the Commonwealth and will have a phased opening commencing in about 6 weeks. Of note, Commissioner Fowler will be giving Psychiatry Grand Rounds on November 8, 2012 and Dr. Pinals will be giving Psychiatry Grand Rounds on December 20 th). PSYCHIATRY DEPARTMENT'S FIVE YEAR REVIEW PROCESS SUMMARY – The department received outstanding feedback from reviewers on the UMASS Board of Trustee mandated 5 year review that recently concluded. Dr. Ziedonis summarized the key findings which overall were excellent. The positive findings will help facilitate system supported efforts to enhance our departmental mission areas. A strategic plan to transition from paper to electronic submissions that will allow the IRB to review and approve submissions to the office during the transition phase and insure that no ongoing research approvals lapse has been developed. Training opportunities for users are being scheduled for September 2012 to prepare to use the system when we "go-live" on October 1, 2012. These submissions will be processed and scheduled for IRB Meetings during the month of September. We have added an additional IRB meeting in the month of September in order to address the expected large number of submissions.

Reportable New Information submissions have no deadline and are the only submissions that will continue to be accepted after August 29th. Submissions of all other types will resume with implementation of the electronic system on October 1.

For Continuing Review Progress Reports, reminder notices will be sent in the coming weeks if your research approval is set to expire on or before November 30, 2012. (Depending on when the IRB conducts the Continuing Review of a given study, the expiration date may change.)

Any exceptions to the above transition plan must be discussed with Michael Centola, IRB Manager, and will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis.
