	<p>Dr. Ziedonis greeted everyone and thanked the department for their hard work over the summer months related to budgets and preparations for the arrival of new students and residents.</p> <p>Dr. Eric Dickson, President of the UMass Memorial Medical Group (UMMMG) led off the meeting with updates on the UMMMG, Hospital President Succession Planning, President/CEO Succession Planning, and a Finance/Budget Update.</p> <p>Dr. Dickson addressed the transition from "for service contract" to "shared risk type contract" (distributing the cost of health care services across large number of participants) as we prepare for national healthcare reform through the Affordable Care Act. Our patient population is defined through our primary care base and 2013-2014 will be a major transition year for the way we deliver healthcare. Though it will be a difficult transition, it will be an exciting opportunity to change the way we deliver care and will be better for providers and patients.</p> <p>Next, Dr. Dickson addressed two important ongoing searches: The Board members for the Health System have moved to the second round of interviews for President and CEO (replacing John O'Brien) and hopefully will make a selection in October or November. The search for the Medical Center President (position vacated by Walter Ettinger) is well underway and search committee will narrow down the search to two or three candidates to present to the new Medical Center CEO. Other active searches underway are for CNO and Sr. VP for the Medical Group.</p> <p>Dr. Dickson gave a finance update for the Health System and Medical Group. June, July and August revenues fell off resulting in pressure for FY13 Budget. Operating margin is off due to volume loss. Though ambulatory continues to grow, downsizing will be necessary as volume decreases. There is hope that volume drop off will be good as we prepare for new changes in clinical practice, quality management and financial accountability.</p> <p>Diego Vazquez, Vice Provost for Research/Asst Vice Provost RFS, gave an in-depth presentation on Conflict of Interest Training – the new requirement for all PI/Co-PI's which went "live" 8/1/2012. The new UMMS policy covers all sponsored project activity (not just PHS/federal) The purpose of the regulation is</p>

Tapper, Ph.D., has accepted my invitation to serve as Interim Director of the UMass Department of Psychiatry's Irving S. and Betty Brudnick Neuropsychiatric Research Institute (BNRI). Dr. Tapper is an Associate Professor who joined the Department of Psychiatry in 2006 and has been extremely productive as a researcher, mentor, teacher, and leader in his BNRI laboratory. The lab focuses on the molecular basis of nicotine addiction, with an emphasis on neuronal nicotinic acetylcholine receptors in addiction and neurological disease.</p> <p>Dr. Tapper and Dr. Paul Gardner co-lead their merged laboratories and are an excellent team. Dr. Gardner will continue to serve as the Associate Director of the BNRI. Dr. Tapper will report directly to Dr. Jean King, who will continue to provide oversight for the BNRI / CCNI in her role as vice chair of research for the Department of Psychiatry.</p> <p>► It is with great sadness that we must inform you of the passing of long-time colleague, friend and mentor Ken Fletcher. Ken died quietly at home on Tuesday after a long illness. For many years Ken provided statistical analysis and guidance to a wide variety of projects for many members of the University community. He is survived by his wife, Dorothy, daughter Thies, and twin grand-daughters, Rhys and Celeste. Funeral arrangements are not yet complete, but a memorial service is planned for early September. Dr. Ginther is a Professor of Economics and the Director of the Center for Science Technology & Economic Policy at the Institute for Policy & Social Research at the University of Kansas. She led the recent NIH study looking at NIH funding and the impact of race and ethnicity. Her findings of disparities fueled an NIH response from the director, Dr. Francis Collins, who has pledged to take action to rectify these inequities. Dr. Collins has fully engaged Dr. Ginther in this process and looks to the study for adequate ways to increase the NIH funding.

► Pilot funds are available to increase collaboration related to the UMMS Department of Psychiatry and Assumption College Collaborative Pilot Research Program initiative which hopes to establish partnerships between our faculty that will increase our understanding of brain disorders and behavior and foster and accelerate joint submissions for larger federal and non-federal funding.

	<p>at 6 lbs and 3 oz and 19 " long.</p> <p>Wendy Marsh, received NARSAD Young Investigator Award 2012 for her study "Randomized Double-Blind Placebo-Controlled Pilot Study of Vitamin D Supplementation for the Treatment of Bipolar Depression". (Dr. Marsh, in a search for a well tolerated and safe option that would reduce depression symptoms in BP, believes vitamin D supplementation might be that treatment. Vitamin D acts in parts of the brain known to be involved in mood and also affects several of the key neurotransmitters targeted by antidepressants and mood stabilizers. In a randomized double-blind placebo-controlled pilot trial of vitamin D supplementation, participants will have BP depression and low vitamin D levels in their blood. Their mood and vitamin D levels will then be followed to see if an increase in vitamin D blood levels is associated with improved mood, and in particular less depression.)</p>
