

Customized Employment and Training Model for Young Adults with Asperger's Disorder

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Employment Training

A customized employment training study at the University of Massachusetts Medical School is offering paid internships at various worksites within the medical school for young adults with Asperger's Disorder, who have little to no work experience.

With the help of UMASS staff, through on-site employment supports, study participants will acquire the skills and knowledge needed to obtain employment in the competitive workforce.

Study Participants Must:

- Be 18-28 years old
- Meet the criteria for Asperger's Disorder
- Be willing and able to work
