Course Overview

The Center for Integrated Primary Care at the University of Massachusetts is proud to offer this Certificate course in Integrated Care Management.

Logging in to the Course

If we have not received your tuition payment you will not be able to login to the course.

Logging in for the first time:

1. Go to <https://umassmed.umassonline.net>
2. Click on **Need Your Password?** Under the Blackboard Learn login area.
3. Using Option 1, enter your first and last name and your username, which is the email address you used to register for the course. For example, when logging into Blackboard Learn, you will enter that full email address in the Username field (i.e., john.doe@gmail.com).
4. You will be sent an email immediately which will allow you to set your password.
5. Follow the instructions in the email to set your password.

Note - During registration, it is important to double check to make sure you've entered the right email address. Also for those using organizations/company's email addresses, there could be a spam filter that prevents you from receiving emails. Please be sure to check your junk mail to see if information on how to set your password has been filtered as a junk mail.

Navigating through the course
