

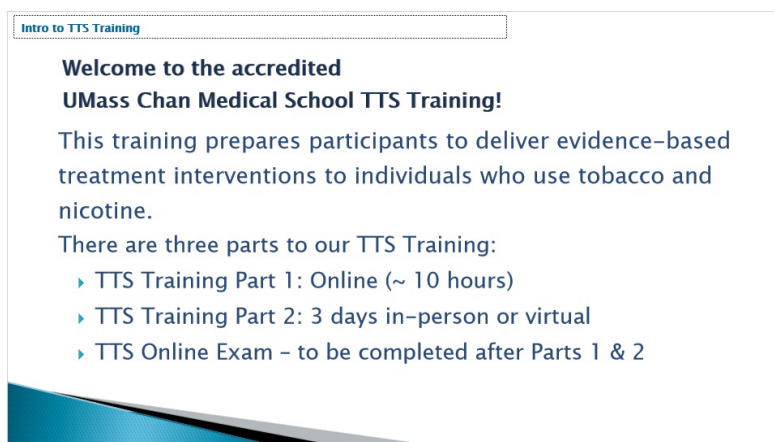

We will be discussing commercial tobacco, not traditional use of tobacco

- When discussing tobacco and nicotine use in this training we will be focusing on commercial tobacco.
- **Traditional tobacco** is and has been used in sacred ways by American Indians for centuries. It is tobacco and/or other plant mixtures grown or harvested and used for ceremonial or medicinal purposes.
- **Commercial tobacco** is mass-produced for profit by companies with addictive nicotine for recreational use. It contains chemical additives and is linked with death and disease.

A Note on Language . . .

- ▶ Throughout this course we will be using the term “tobacco treatment” instead of “cessation” – we provide treatment; cessation is something that a person who uses tobacco may do.
- ▶ We aim to use person-first language; for example, a “person who uses tobacco” versus “tobacco user” with a goal to destigmatize substance use.
- ▶ When providing statistics that report on gender, race, or ethnicity we will use the term used by the citation for describing the data.

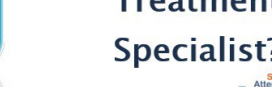

What is a Tobacco Treatment Specialist?

Tobacco Treatment Specialists (TTS) are professionals who possess the skills, knowledge, and training to provide effective, evidence-based interventions to treat tobacco and nicotine dependence.

TTS offer treatment to individuals using a range of treatment intensities, contexts, and modalities, and they treat individuals in a variety of settings.

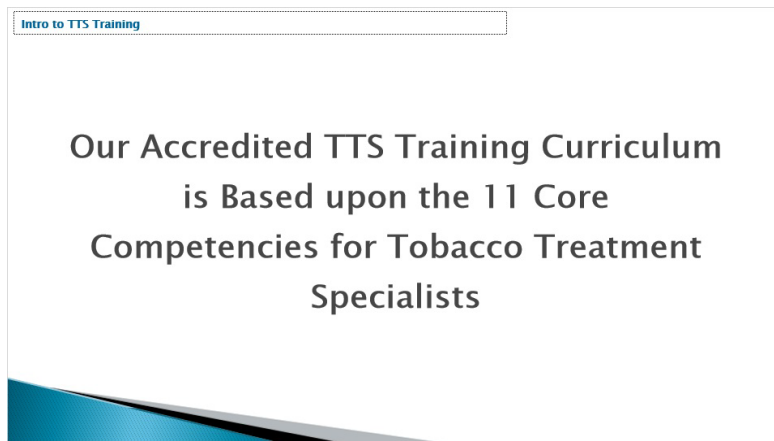

TTS: 11 Core Competencies

- 1. Tobacco Dependence Knowledge and Education**
Provide clear and accurate information about tobacco use, strategies for quitting, the scope of the health impact on the population, the causes and consequences of tobacco use
- 2. Counseling Skills**
Demonstrate effective application of counseling theories and strategies to establish a collaborative relationship, and to facilitate client involvement in treatment and commitment to change

- This training program has been designed to address all of these competencies
- Details of each competency can be found on the ATTUD website listed on the slide and **also in the handouts section**.
- The competencies were first described by UMass and the Massachusetts Tobacco Control Program. ATTUD refined and endorsed these in 2005.
- Role as a TTS may include educating others in your organization about evidence-based interventions, including pharmacotherapy, and organizational systems to support those interventions.

Note: TTS in organizations may find resistance in using their knowledge and/or being seen as a resource about tobacco dependence treatment. For example, TTS have been met with resistance in suggesting pharmacotherapy to clients or advocating for changes in data collection and evaluation. If you have time, ask participants to reflect on challenges they may have had, and ask others how they have successfully overcome those challenges.

- 3. Assessment Interview**
Conduct an assessment interview to obtain comprehensive and accurate data needed for treatment planning
- 4. Treatment Planning**
Demonstrate the ability to develop an individualized treatment plan using evidence-based treatment strategies
- 5. Pharmacotherapy**
Provide clear and accurate information about pharmacotherapy options available and their therapeutic use.

6. Relapse Prevention
Offer methods to reduce relapse and provide ongoing support for tobacco-dependent persons
7. Diversity and Specific Health Issues
Demonstrate competence in working with population subgroups and those who have specific health issues
8. Documentation and Evaluation
Describe and use methods for tracking individual progress, record keeping, program documentation, outcome measurement and reporting

9. Professional Resources
Utilize resources available for client support and for professional education or consultation

10. Law and Ethics
Consistently use a code of ethics and adhere to government regulations specific to the health care or work site setting

TTS Code of Ethics

A tobacco treatment specialist will strive to maintain the highest level of professional competence and professional and personal conduct and will:

- Respect the privacy, dignity and culture of all individuals and ensure fair and equitable treatment of all individuals.
- Provide people with all relevant and accurate information and resources so they may make their choices freely and intelligently.
- Observe principles of informed consent and confidentiality of individuals.

TTS Code of Ethics

- ▶ Be truthful in dealings with the public, never misrepresenting or exaggerating potential benefits or services.
- ▶ Avoid activities which may be or may be perceived to be a conflict of interest or unethical in nature.
- ▶ Maintain the highest level of competence through continued study and training.

TTS Code of Ethics

- ▶ Accurately represent capabilities, education, training and experience, and act within the boundaries of professional competence, recognizing one's limitations and seeking help or providing appropriate referrals when confronted with issues of mental illness or psychosocial problems that the TTS may not be trained to handle.

What ethical dilemmas have you or a colleague faced?
What are some ways you could handle them?

- After reviewing, ask if participants have any examples of ethical dilemmas they have faced and how they were handled.
- Suggestions for discussion:
 - Your client has begun to ask personal questions of you and asks to follow you on your personal social media accounts.
 - You disagree with the care given to your client by another provider, and you tell your client why the provider is wrong.
 - Your client tells you that she is being treated by a licensed therapist for a behavioral health disorder, but she would prefer to work with you on those issues because you "seem to understand." You do not have training as a counselor/therapist.
