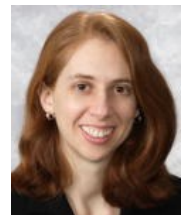
Konstantin Abramov, MD



Konstantin Abramov, MD is Assistant Professor in our Renal Division, Director of the Chronic Kidney Disease Program and Associate Program Director of the Nephrology Fellowship at UMass Medical School/UMass Memorial. Dr. Abramov was nominated for this award by Dr. Jeffrey Stoff in the Excellence Award Clinical category for his compassion as a skilled clinician and his extraordinary contribution to improving the outcomes of patients with Chronic Kidney Disease (CKD) and End Stage Renal Disease (ESRD). This has been demonstrated through his quality scholar project on timely detection of chronic kidney disease, as well as a long list of clinical innovations that have directly improved the quality of care and experience for our patients and their family members.

Sarah Cutrona, MD, MPH

Sarah Cutrona, MD, MPH of our General Internal Medicine and Primary Care Division is an Assistant Professor of Medicine, as well as Assistant Professor of Quantitative Health Sciences at UMass Medical School/UMass Memorial. Dr. Cutrona was nominated by Kathy Mazor in the Excellence Award Research category for her research in health care delivery, screening, and prevention. Her work to improve screening and vaccination rates, as well as electronic communications with patients is greatly appreciated.



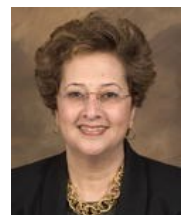
Farhan Ibrahim, MD
