 losartan–hydrochlorothiazide (HYZAAR) 100–25mg tablet Sig: Take 1 tablet by mouth daily
 melatonin 5mg tablet Sig: Take 5mg by mouth with evening meal
 sildenafil (VIAGRA) 100mg tablet Sig: Take 1 tablet by mouth prn as directed for erectile dysfunction.
