Adult-Gerontology Primary Care Nurse Practitioner



Adult-Gerontology Primary Care Nurse Practitioners provide primary care services to individuals ranging in age from adolescents through senescence throughout the continuum of care and across practice settings.

This Post Graduate Certificate is an 18 credit program of study that can be completed in two semesters full time. Students will complete 540 clinical hours in a variety of ambulatory settings with individuals ranging in age from adolescents through older adults. Upon successful completion of the program, graduates are eligible to sit for Adult-Gerontology Primary Care NP certification exam given by ANCC and/or AANP.

Applicant's must be a practicing NP with an MS or doctoral degree who are certified as an NP in another practice specialty, including but not limited to: Acute Care, Adult, Pediatrics, Women's Health, and Psychiatric Mental Health. A review of previous course work prior to admission will be required to ensure eligibility for certification.
