



Post Graduate Certificate Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner



This is a 22 credit Post Graduate Certificate that can be completed in three semesters full time, five semesters part time with a hybrid course delivery. Students will complete 630 clinical hours in a variety of setting with Children, Adults and Older Adults. Graduates are eligible to sit for the Psychiatric Mental Health NP certification exam given by ANCC upon successful completion of the program. Applicants must be a practicing NP with an MS or doctoral degree who are certified as Adult, Gerontology, Adult-Gerontology Primary or Acute Care, Family or Pediatric NPs. A review of previous course work prior to admission will be required to ensure eligibility for certification. You may take 2-3 courses as a non matriculated student before applying. .
