


## Child Care Information & Referral Safeguards

- Child Care referrals are only given for licensed child care sources.
  - For example, if a family home daycare is requested, only a licensed family center will be given as a referral. No unlicensed facilities/family day care programs will be referred.
- Licensed nanny agencies may be provided, as well as babysitter websites.
- Individual babysitter/nanny names will not be shared as background, experience, and suitability cannot be confirmed.
- The EAP does not endorse any specific child care provider nor will it recommend a specific provider.

## **Child Care Information & Referral Steps**

- 1. EAP provides you with a DocuSign consent form to begin the search and referral process.
- 2. Once form is completed, a child care assessment will be conducted with you, via phone, gathering information including:
  - Type of child care desired
  - Age of child(ren)
  - Distance from your place of employment (or residence)
  - Times of child care needed
  - Cost parameters / budget
  - Child specific needs (e.g., nut-free environment)
  - Other relevant information



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## Child Care Information & Referrals Steps

#### 3. Let our research team do the work for you!

A customized search of licensed providers and relevant information will be completed for you

#### 4. What can you expect?

- An emailed cover letter stating what research took place
- An official referral: our research team verbally spoke with the resource/provider and confirmed information
- If applicable, any information re: resource/provider that did not provide a response within the turn-around time
- Information regarding child care and tip sheets specific to your family's needs

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## **EAP Supports Parents of School-Aged Children**

- EAP offers support for parents of school-aged children, including:
  - Confidential and professional support for common parenting challenges, including support for effective coparenting
  - Support for parents of children with special needs
  - Confidential and professional support for children who may be experiencing bullying, anxiety, or struggles at school
  - Referrals to financial professionals for setting up a college fund
  - Referrals to summer camps and aftercare programs

## Affording Child Care Options and Information Available for You

## Dependent Care Assistance Program (DCAP)

- Available only to benefit-eligible employees. **Annual enrollment required**. Offered at UMass Chan Medical School, sponsored by the Group Insurance Commission (GIC) and administered by TASC.
- Use **pre-tax dollars** to pay for child care expenses (daycare, camp and pre-k) for eligible dependents up to age 13. DCAP funds must be spent down in the allotted time frame (approx. 14 months). Any unspent funds at the end of the grace period are forfeited to the plan.
- Contribute any amount up to \$5,000 per family each plan year on a pre-tax basis. Reduces your taxable income and helps save you money.
- Enroll as a new hire during your first 21 days of employment or during the open enrollment period held annually for a July 1 effective date.

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## **UMass Chan Child Care Assistance Program**

- UMass Chan provides a child care assistance program to help make child care for children in pre-kindergarten or younger affordable for working parents. The program pays a portion of child care costs for non-union employees at UMass Chan for any licensed child care provider.
- Eligibility You and your spouse or partner must have a combined gross family income of \$100,000 or less to be eligible for this program.

## Child Care Subsidies Available Through the Commonwealth of Massachusetts

- Child Care Financial Assistance (CCFA)
  - Helps eligible families pay for child care and out-of-school time programs
  - Apply over the phone by dialing 2-1-1 and using extension 23

- Child Care Resource and Referral Agencies (CCR&Rs)
  - CCR&Rs support local communities by assisting families in finding child care that meets their needs, and helping eligible families obtain child care financial assistance.
