

Objectives




Provide Provide a brief overview of the study to someone who is not familiar in a way that demonstrates respect for their context (role, education, cultural background)

Utilize Utilize collaborative and equity-based communication skills to describe your research to a new teammate

Employ Employ a checklist to identify areas for improvement

Deliberate Practice Draft and practice an approach to improve communication; capture this to share.



Timing and Structure

- 65 minutes for two sessions:
 - 2 cycles x 30 min each, 5 min transition
 - 2 iSPARC team members (participant or observer)
 - SP is both portrayer and facilitator
 - Additional facilitator for 1 session each

Specific details of timing

For each cycle

- 10 minutes - SP interaction with iSPARC participant (confirm case)
- 2 minutes - iSPARC participant uses checklist for self-reflection on areas for improvement; SP completes checklist; iSPARC observer completes checklist
- 5 minutes - Feedback from SP and iSPARC observer
- 3 minutes - Plan deliberate practice
- 10 minutes - Deliberate practice and discussion

iSPARC members change roles/repeat with 2nd case
