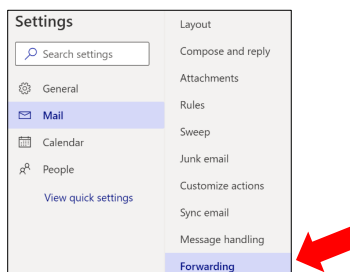
2. Once in your email account, click on the Settings gear located in the top right corner of the screen.



3. Click "View all Outlook settings" at the bottom of the menu.



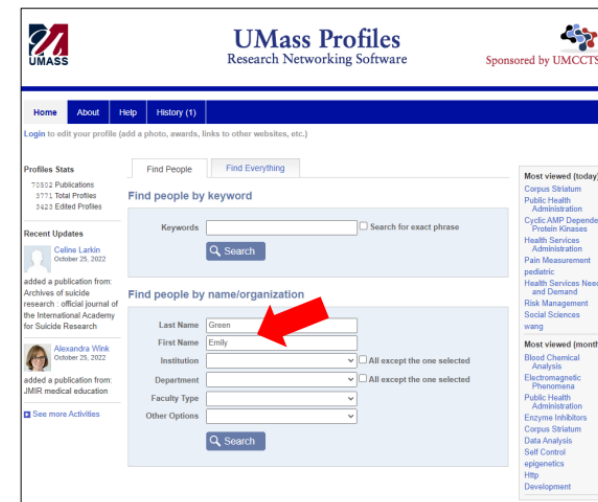
4. Under Mail settings, choose "Forwarding"
