
## $\textbf{Chalk Talk} \rightarrow \textbf{off-the-cuff teaching relevant to current medical care using paper or a white/chalk board}$

- 1. <u>Timeliness</u> → <20-30 minutes
  - Strong leadership
  - Stay on task
- 2. Relevance → current medical problems
  - Generalized
  - "Hard" findings

- 3. <u>Verbalization</u> → structure and preparation
  - Learning objectives
  - Talking > writing
  - <u>Teaching Scripts</u> and <u>Diagnostic Schemas</u>





- 4. <u>Participation</u> → ask questions
  - Allow the learners to do the bulk of the talking
  - Use the Socratic method
- 5. Adaptability → based on the level of the learner(s)
