<i>Chair's Welcome</i> Featured presentations and discussions	<p>Welcoming Remarks and Announcements noted below were provided by Dr. Sheldon Benjamin to open today's meeting. Dr. Benjamin also welcomed those departmental faculty who participated in today's meeting via ZOOM.</p> <p>Featured presentation, related questions, and discussions regarding EPIC implementation and troubleshooting were productive and helped to identify Psychiatry-specific issues in EPIC to be reviewed and improved upon. Discussion was led by UMMHC Hospital Leaders as well as departmental Superusers, Trainers and Coordinators. Cui; & Carol DeCourcey, Mary Innis, Samantha Mitchell, Michelle Mullaney, Sherri Chapman, Kelly Chabot, Tara Caramanica, and Venera Xhafa).</p> <p>EPIC key issues raised and recorded by Kathlee Li are outlined below for further follow-up and discussion by Barbara Fisher and the EPIC team.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CANDO clinic: certain staff cannot access what they need for work. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◦ APP cannot do ECPS ◦ Research/clinical coordinator is unable to input clinical data for research into chart. Needs to go into flowsheets ◦ Speech therapy, occupational therapy, physical therapy, psychologist Dragon access • Psychotherapy billing: LOS is a hard stop. Supervising attending is not available to cc if they are PhDs. Have been routing all notes/charts to one provider. 	

Chair's Announcements	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Patient movement : job aids are being updated, but there are site specific flows, and many workarounds are being developed <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◦ Psych --> Medicine ◦ Medicine --> Psych ◦ ED --> EMH ◦ EMH --> psych floor • EMH billing: PB charges are not coming through consistently. Will have a dedicated meeting for EMH billing coming up. • OP Billing: was taught that PCAs would be entering the LOS, and that clinicians would not be seeing LOS activity. This is not the current set up <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◦ Professional fees going to facility side ◦ Missing charges ◦ Working closely with Epic • IP Billing: IP attending wrote note, but forgot to drop bill. Encounter is closed. Patrick Smallwood • IP Treatment Plans: no room to document treatment plans for multi-disciplinary teams. • Confusion regarding whether or not charges were dropped prior to closing an encounter • ECPS: Hahnemann family and S3-424 does not enough fingerprint readers • Patient diagnosis erroneous printing on paper prescriptions <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◦ Solution: should select "Not Share" on the problem list. This will also prevent the problem from appearing on the patient's MyChart • Unable to see medication history for meds. This information was NOT converted into Epic from Allscripts. In order to review medication history (eg., for controlled substances), you must reference Allscripts. • Difficulty retrieving old Sorian records. Discharge notes are present, Admission notes are not • Also, a question was raised about whether or not one can complete an encounter without dropping a charge. The key training point is that in order to close an encounter, one must sign the visit. You cannot sign a visit without dropping a LOS charge. There is a hard stop when you attempt to sign your visit. Visits that have not been signed will also show up in a users InBasket, prompting them to complete all necessary documentation. The state subsequently asked that the BNRI building be vacated in anticipation of external transfer of the property. With the exception of Dr. Rogaev who will remain in Psychiatry, all other BNRI faculty (Drs. Tapper, Gardner, Melikian, and Martin) will move their primary appointments from Psychiatry to Neurobiology in January, but maintain secondary appointments in psychiatry. The group has already moved their laboratories to the Lazare Research Building. The CCNI's magnet and facility will be relocated to the University campus.
