The Advanced Generalist Registered Nurse (AGRN) is designed for individuals who hold a minimum of a BA or BS in a non-nursing major and whose career and educational goals include nursing practice at the advanced generalist level. Students become eligible after the pre-licensure year to sit for the NCLEX examination followed by three additional semesters of course work. Graduates of this program are Master's prepared RNs who are prepared to lead interprofessional evidenced-based initiatives across multiple settings and populations.

The University of Massachusetts Medical School is the Commonwealth's first and only public academic health sciences center, home to three graduate schools. These graduate schools include the School of Medicine, the *Graduate School of Nursing*, and the Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences.
