## **ONLINE Post Master's to DNP Program**





The University of Massachusetts Medical School is the commonwealth's first and only public academic health sciences center, home to the School of Medicine, *Graduate School of Nursing* and the Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences. The Post Mater's Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) Program is for applicants who have a master's degree as registered nurses certified and practicing as advanced practice nurses or in the role of nurse administrators who seek a doctoral degree in nursing as clinical and health care practice leaders.

The purpose of the Post Master's Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) program at the University of Massachusetts Worcester is to prepare nurse practitioner and nurse administrators graduates for advanced nursing practice leadership roles. The curriculum is designed to educate students to improve and transform health care through systems leadership, research translation, policy, and advanced clinical knowledge. Graduates are prepared to assume advanced nursing practice leadership roles in hospitals and community-based settings, health care organizations, and schools of nursing as clinical faculty.

## Admission Requirements

Admission to the DNP in Nursing program is based on an overall appraisal of the applicant's ability to undertake doctoral study and of their potential contributions to advanced nursing practice. An admission interview is required. Applications to the DNP program will be considered complete when all of the following have been

- Completed on-line application via Nursing CAS
- Completed Personal Statement (see Nursing CAS for further instructions)
- Official transcripts from all colleges and universities attended  $\Diamond$
- Two letters of recommendation, from persons whom you have been in contact within the last five years: (I) A recent supervisor who can evaluate APN (Advanced Practice Nurse) or nurse administrator employment experience, (2) A professional reference from a Masters or Doctoral prepared nurse who can speak to your potential for academic success and can evaluate your leadership potential as an APN or nurse administrator with a DNP, submitted to Nursing CAS
- $\Diamond$ Evidence of an unrestricted license Massachusetts licensure as an RN
- Resume submitted to Nursing CAS and Completed Checklist from website  $\Diamond$
- $\Diamond$ Application fee made payable to the Graduate School of Nursing
- A notarized proof of residency (all applicants, both Massachusetts Residents and non-residents, must submit)
