(OBJECTIVES)

1. To clarify how dimensions of aging physiology inherently predispose to CVD, and to clarify related possibilities for prevention.
2. To discuss how aging impacts evidence-based standards of CVD management, including dimensions of prevention, diagnosis, prognosis, and management.
3. To clarify how geriatric cardiology is distinct from palliative care and constitutes a distinctive skillset for clinicians who care for older patients.
