SUMMER 2024 UNDERGRADUATE CLINICAL & TRANSLATIONAL RESEARCH INTERNSHIP PROGRAM REQUEST FOR APPLICATIONS

Application Deadline: **February 12, 2024 at Noon ET**

BACKGROUND

A major goal of the **University of Massachusetts Center for Clinical and Translational Science (UMCCTS)** is to develop a rigorously trained workforce that supports high-quality, innovative and impactful clinical and translational research. Clinical Research Professionals (CRPs), the research team members who oversee and implement clinical trials and other clinical research studies, are essential to the conduct of clinical research. However, there is a shortage of CRPs, and the career options are not always well-known, even among those interested in healthcare. To expose highly motivated, promising undergraduate students to the roles held by CRPs – and to clinical research, more broadly - this internship will combine didactic training with hands-on, project-based experiential learning.

This program, offered by UMCCTS in partnership with UMass campuses throughout the commonwealth, will offer **12 full-time internship positions for Summer 2024**.

ELIGIBILITY FOR THE INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

- Applicants must be:
 - a US citizen, non-citizen national, or permanent resident.
 - a UMass student who will be a rising Junior, Senior, or recent graduate as of June 2024.

INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

Interns will be paired with Clinical Research Professional (CRP) mentors to train **full-time** (approx. 40 hours/week) **onsite** as part of a clinical research study team **for 10 weeks, from May 28 through August 2, 2024 on one of the UMass Chan Medical School campuses (Worcester, Springfield or Burlington)**. Throughout this time, interns will be exposed to an array of both didactic and experiential learning opportunities. Didactic learning will include completion of UMCCTS' Introductory Clinical Research Coordinator course, CITI Human Subjects Research and Good Clinical Practices training courses, Privacy and Conflict of Interest training, and regulatory training. The experiential component will place interns with clinical research study teams, including a designated clinical research professional mentor. Interns will also attend Clinical Research Professional Group (CRPG) and IRB meetings, and participate in weekly group learning experiences that include invited panel discussions and an integrative seminar.

This is a paid internship. Please note that interns will be expected to provide their own housing accommodations and transportation to the assigned campus each day.*

These meetings will provide you with an overview of the program and application process and an opportunity to ask questions. Former interns and study team mentors will be in attendance to share their experiences.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Applications will be accepted at: <https://arcsapps.umassmed.edu/redcap/surveys/?s=TDYY99HT8T> until **February 12, 2024 at Noon**. In addition to completing several demographic and qualification-related questions, the following materials will be required as part of your application:

- **Current Academic Transcript:** An unofficial UMass transcript is required. If you have transferred from another undergraduate college or university, a transcript from that institution will also be required.
- **Resume:** A one page resume, detailing relevant knowledge, skills, abilities, and experiences, must be included.
- **Personal Statement:** In 500 words or less, please address the following: 1) Your interest(s) in the healthcare field; 2) What draws you to learn more about healthcare research; 3) Your career plans or goals following graduation (Note: being undecided is fine, though please discuss); 4) What interests you most about this internship.
- **Letter of Recommendation:** One letter of recommendation from an academic source (e.g., course instructor, academic advisor, or research mentor) who can attest to your suitability for a professional research career in healthcare is required. Please have your recommender submit the letter at the application link listed above.
- **Financial Need Information (optional):** *Housing and/or transportation support *may* be available on a limited basis to students with demonstrated need.

In order to provide the best mentoring team:intern matches, the application form asks applicants to select one or more teams that they would be interested in working with. Brief descriptions of each participating team's research will be made available on the program website (<https://www.umassmed.edu/ccts/education/ccts-summer-undergraduate-research-internship/>) by the end of January, 2024. Applicants may opt to return to their application to make or update these selections through the February 12 deadline. If no selections are made, applicant will be considered for all internship positions.
