

Patient-Centered Healthcare (PCH)

Building relationships and managing care coordination

Patient-Centered Healthcare is an online e-learning course for nurses, social workers, and those in allied health professions whose role it is to support patients in primary care by helping them navigate the healthcare system and encouraging them to become active participants in their own healthcare.

Whether the title is Care Manager, Care Coordinator, Patient Navigator, coach, or advocate this course aims to provide a solid grounding in the issues of coordinating care for primary care patients in integrated settings. This course covers topics from developing care plans and fostering patient activation to dealing with the elderly, children and families. We explain patient registries and the value of population management.

Patient-centered support and interventions can help motivate and guide patients while monitoring their progress. It is the cornerstone of successful integrated care. Our online training is appropriate for group training in practices, medical groups, and ACOs. Individual participants can learn or refresh their knowledge of medical topics or explore psychosocial content and the issues of special populations.

Curriculum Topics in Patient-Centered Healthcare

The core modules serve as a foundation in care coordination as it is commonly practiced in integrated primary care settings. The elective modules allow participants to explore knowledge they may lack, or topics that are of particular importance in their practices.

Core Modules (all 6 must be completed)

- 3. Networking in the Medical Neighborhood
- 4. Fostering Patient Activation Through Shared Decision Making
- 5. An Introduction to Motivational Interviewing
- 6. Effective Use of Registries to Improve Care for High-Risk Patients
